Notification of McCoy Road Closing

This is to inform you that McCoy Road is scheduled to close 0.5 mile east of Ohio 732 and 1.5 miles west of Bunker Hill Woods Road for a bridge replacement beginning Monday, August 7, 2017. The road is tentatively scheduled to reopen the week of October 2, 2017.

The Project

This project is necessary to replace an aging and deteriorating bridge with a new, safer structure. The existing bridge, which spans Reserve Run, is a single span concrete slab built in 1915. The Engineer's Office plans to replace the old bridge with a new, safer three-sided concrete box structure.

Work will be performed by BCEO crews with structure setting and paving by Barrett Paving Materials, Inc. of Middletown which submitted a low bid of \$155,335. Funding consists of 100 percent local BCEO funds.

Detour and Maintenance of Traffic

During this closure, local access will be maintained for residents and businesses from either side of the bridge, depending upon your location, but motorists will not be permitted to pass through the construction zone and detours will be posted for all thru traffic. Eastbound McCoy Road traffic will detour south on Ohio 732, east on Stillwell Road, and north on Bunker Hill Woods Road to McCoy. Westbound traffic will reverse this route.

Emergency personnel, school bus transportation officials, the post office, and the media have been notified of this upcoming closure. The information is also posted on our web site at www.bceo.org/roadclosings. We apologize for the inconvenience and appreciate your patience.
